Dear XXXXX,

I write in connection with your request for information dated 19th April 2021 concerning dating app offences.

I am required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to handle all requests in a manner that is blind as to the identity and motives of the requestor. Any information released as a response to a request is regarded as being published and therefore in the public domain without caveat.

Following receipt of your request, research was conducted by the Business Intelligence department at Wiltshire Police.

Your request for information has now been considered and I am able to respond as follows.

You wrote:

1) The number of offence records listed in your crime database that contain the following keywords:

- a. "Tinder"
- b. "Grindr"
- c. "Scruff"
- d. "Hinge"
- e. "Bumble"
- f. "dating app"

Please identify these by conducting a free text search of your crime database, and provide information for each of the last five financial years to 05/04/21.

2) A breakdown of the kind of offences recorded that included these keywords, for each individual keyword.

3) An anonymised copy of free text report for each incident recorded.



Our response

Please see attached spreadsheet. To note:

This data was obtained by completing a 'summary', or 'wildcard', search for the terms noted in questions 1a to 1f. This type of search will only provide results where the terms were included in the MO field of an occurrence report. These searches are not considered reliable or accurate for various reasons i.e. the term was mentioned within the occurrence report but not the MO field, the term was misspelt etc. As a result, any occurrence where the term was misspelt or mentioned within the occurrence report would not be returned in the results provided. To accurately and reliably obtain results, a manual search of each crime within the specified timeframe would need to be conducted to establish whether the occurrences are relevant to your request.

Additionally, I sought confirmation from yourself as to whether you would like the (anonymised) occurrence summaries for each of the 515 occurrences returned. You confirmed this was not necessary, but you would like to receive the summaries of any sexual offences returned for the term 'Grindr'. There was one result for the term 'Grindr' and this related to the offence 'robbery personal'. I have therefore not provided this summary, even though it states the aggrieved and suspect met on Grindr, as this is not a sexual offence.

I am satisfied that all the relevant information has been passed to me and been considered in the light of your request within the time constraints applicable under the legislation.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from Wiltshire Police, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing to the:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Force Disclosure Unit within 20 working days of the Force's response to the original FoI request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing to include confirmation of the reasons for the review. The review will be conducted by another Decision Maker, who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Force Disclosure Unit will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within twenty working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The Independent Decision Maker will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, taking into account the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the Independent Decision Maker will reply to the complainant with the result of the review. If the complainant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
