Dear,

I write in connection with your request for information dated 29th July 2021 concerning fleet vehicles.

I am required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to handle all requests in a manner that is blind as to the identity and motives of the requestor. Any information released as a response to a request is regarded as being published and therefore in the public domain without caveat.

Your request for information has now been considered and after having consulted our Fleet Department – I am now able to respond as follows.

You wrote:

1. Is it true that the website called "<https://www.emergency-vehicles.co.uk>" have posted all of the Wiltshire Marked Police Vehicles from 1990-2006?
2. Did the Armed Response Group used these vehicles in the past? (Yes or No For Each Vehicle)
 - 1990-1993 Vauxhall Senator
 - 1993-1997 Volvo 850 Estate
 - 1994-1998 Land Rover Discovery 5-Door (Facelift) (Series I)
 - 1994-1999 Vauxhall Omega Caravan B1
 - 1994-1999 Vauxhall Omega Saloon B1
 - 1997-2000 Ford Mondeo Estate (Facelift)
 - 1997-1998 Vauxhall Vectra Estate
 - 2000-2003 Vauxhall Omega Caravan (Facelift) B2
 - 2000-2003 Vauxhall Omega Saloon (Facelift) B2
 - 2000-2005 Volvo V70
 - 2001-2003 BMW 5 Series Touring (Facelift)

Our response:

1. On the website link provided it states that it is an independent site that buys stock photos from freelance photographers, and this is not something we know anything about and to our knowledge have never engaged in sending photos. As a result, we are unable to

answer that question but it is most likely the case that they do not have pictures of all of our marked vehicles for that time.

2. Our records show that none of these vehicles were used in the times stated. However, this is not to say that we didn't have them but pre-2005 our database was not used to it's fullest capacity and we believe a lot of vehicles were either not entered on the system or were deleted once sold, so unfortunately we are unable to confirm.

I am satisfied that all the relevant information has been passed to me and been considered in the light of your request within the time constraints applicable under the legislation.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from Wiltshire Police, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing to the:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Force Disclosure Unit within 20 working days of the Force's response to the original Fol request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing to include confirmation of the reasons for the review. The review will be conducted by another Decision Maker, who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Force Disclosure Unit will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within twenty working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The Independent Decision Maker will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, taking into account the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the Independent Decision Maker will reply to the complainant with the result of the review. If the complainant is still dissatisfied following the review they should
