I write in connection with your request for information dated 07/12/2022 concerning revenge porn offences with victims aged 0-17 years.

I am required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to handle all requests in a manner that is blind as to the identity and motives of the requestor. Any information released as a response to a request is regarded as being published and therefore in the public domain without caveat.

Male Suspect has distributed nude photos of his ex girlfriend via Social Media. Suspect had told IP that he had deleted the photos when they split but they have been put onto SnapChat and comments are being made.	2017-2018	Snapchat

Suspect has disclosed a private sexual photograph of his ex-girlfriend with intent to cause distress.	2018-2019	Facebook

Known suspect has created fake social media accounts in the IP's name and sent photos of the IP naked to others.	2019-2020	Facebook
Known suspect has sent sexually explicit images and videos of IP to IPs mother.	2019-2020	Whatsapp
Known male suspect has sent videos of himself and the IP having sexual intercourse to a third party. Both the suspect and the IP were aged 16 at the time the video was made.	2019-2020	Instagram/ Snapchat
Known male has sent images online via tiktok to a group of males which show him and the IP having sexual intercourse. He has threatened to post further videos online if she does not go back out with him.	2020-2021	TikTok
Known male suspect has posted nude picture of the IP onto a 'baiting' sight on shapchat.	2020-2021	Snapchat

After the IP has sent two pictures of herself wearing a thong and a video of her twerking to a male known as Josh he has shared them on an application called YUBO and then shared them with tow females who subsequently informed the IP.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from Wiltshire Police, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing to the:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Force Disclosure Unit within 20 working days of the Force's response to the original FoI request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing to include confirmation of the reasons for the review. The review will be conducted by another Decision Maker, who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Force Disclosure Unit will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within twenty working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The Independent Decision Maker will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, taking into account the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the Independent Decision Maker will reply to the complainant with the result of the review. If the complainant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
