Dear,

I write in connection with your request for information dated 22nd June 2023 concerning the Wiltshire Police crest.

I am required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to handle all requests in a manner that is blind as to the identity and motives of the requestor. Any information released as a response to a request is regarded as being published and therefore in the public domain without caveat.

Your request for information has now been considered and after having consulted our Digital Engagement & Corporate Communications and Engagement teams – I am now able to respond as follows.

You wrote:

I have noticed that the crown on the Wiltshire Police crest has become a Tudor crown. Please give an updated version of the logo guidelines attached to FOI 2022/529.

Our response:

No information held – we do not currently hold an updated version of the logo guidelines previously provided to you under FOI 2022/529.

However, as part of our Section 16 duty to provide advice and assistance where possible, please be advised that it is most likely the main Wiltshire Police Facebook page that features an updated crest and this was put in place following the ascension of the King using the crown from the updated royal cipher. However, following this, forces were advised that they shouldn't split out the elements from the cipher to update their crests. A hold was subsequently put on updating all other insignia across our branding but a decision was made to leave the Facebook page as is, as we expected to receive updated guidance quickly (albeit we are still awaiting the guidance). We are expecting update guidance imminently that will allow us to update all our insignia across our channels, our equipment, fleet and estates.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from Wiltshire Police, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing to the:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Force Disclosure Unit within 20 working days of the Force's response to the original FOI request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing to include confirmation of the reasons for the review. The review will be conducted by another Decision Maker, who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Force Disclosure Unit will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within twenty working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The Independent Decision Maker will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, taking into account the matters raised by the complaint.

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4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the Independent Decision Maker will reply to the complainant with the result of the review. If the complainant is still dissatisfied following the review, they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
