Dear,

I write in connection with your request for information dated 10th January 2026 concerning traffic offences.

I am required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to handle all requests in a manner that is blind as to the identity and motives of the requestor. Any information released as a response to a request is regarded as being published and therefore in the public domain without caveat.

Your request for information has now been considered and I am able to respond as follows.

You Wrote:

I am requesting the following information relating specifically to the B3098 through Edington, Wiltshire, for the period 1 January 2014 to the present, or for as many of those years as records are held.

For all sections below, please provide the data broken down by calendar year.

1. Traffic Enforcement – Speeding and Other Moving Traffic Offences (Annual Breakdown)
For the B3098 within the parish boundary of Edington, from 1 January 2014 to present:
For each calendar year:

Number of recorded speeding offences

Number of other traffic-related enforcement actions (e.g., careless driving, mobile phone use, no insurance)

For each category, the annual breakdown of:

Method of detection (officer observation, mobile camera unit, fixed camera, CSW referral)

Outcome (warning, fixed penalty, prosecution, no further action)

2. Pavement Parking and Obstruction (Annual Breakdown)

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For each calendar year from 2014 to present:

- Number of recorded incidents, complaints, or enforcement actions relating to:
 - Vehicles parking on pavements
 - Vehicles obstructing pedestrians

For each incident, the annual breakdown of:

- Reporting method (999, 101, online, CSW referral)
- Whether officers attended
- Enforcement outcome (warning, ticket, no further action)

3. Community Speed Watch (CSW) Activity (Annual Breakdown)

For any CSW activity conducted on the B3098 in Edington, for each calendar year from 2014 to present:

- Number of CSW sessions
- Number of vehicles monitored
- Number of vehicles recorded exceeding the threshold
- Number of letters issued
- Number of referrals to Wiltshire Police
- Any follow-up enforcement activity by Wiltshire Police arising from CSW data

4. CSW Reports of Pavement Parking (Annual Breakdown)

For each calendar year from 2014 to present:

- Whether CSW volunteers reported any pavement-parking or obstruction issues
- Number of such reports
- Any action taken by Wiltshire Police

2023 – Speeding in a 30mph limit (officer observed and Fixed Penalty Notice)

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2024 – No Insurance (officer observed and Fixed Penalty Notice)

2025 – Driving without due care and attention (officer observed and Fixed Penalty Notice)

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from Wiltshire Police, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing to the:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Force Disclosure Unit within 20 working days of the Force's response to the original Fol request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing to include confirmation of the reasons for the review. The review will be conducted by another Decision Maker, who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Force Disclosure Unit will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within twenty working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The Independent Decision Maker will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, taking into account the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the Independent Decision Maker will reply to the complainant with the result of the review. If the complainant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
