I write in connection with your request for information dated 11th March 2026, concerning process, system or format for internally sharing evidence-based policing (EBP) initiatives.

I am required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to handle all requests in a manner that is blind as to the identity and motives of the requestor. Any information released as a response to a request is regarded as being published and therefore in the public domain without caveat.

Following receipt of your request, research was conducted by the Neighbourhood Harm Reduction Unit at Wiltshire Police.

Your request for information has now been considered and I am able to respond as follows.

You wrote and our response:

Please could you provide the following:

1. Does the force have a formal process, system, or standardised format for internally sharing examples of evidence-based policing (EBP) initiatives?
 - o This may include internal repositories, templates, portals, knowledge-sharing platforms, case study formats, newsletters, or any other documented method used to disseminate EBP learning within the organisation.

Yes. Wiltshire Police has used several mechanisms to share examples of evidence-based practice and organisational learning. These include:

1. **AiR Journal - An internal journal used to publish examples of operational practice, case studies, and learning from evidence-informed initiatives.**
2. **Flipside Learning Events - Knowledge-sharing events where officers, staff and partner organisations present innovative approaches, partnership initiatives and examples of evidence-informed practice.**
3. **Problem-Oriented Policing (POP) Practice Bank - Wiltshire Police maintains a repository of Problem-Oriented Policing plans. These capture examples of structured problem-solving activity using recognised methodologies such as the SARA model (Scanning, Analysis, Response and Assessment).**

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4. **Tilley Award Submission - Wiltshire Police has also submitted an entry to the national Tilley Awards, which recognise outstanding examples of problem-oriented and evidence-based policing practice.**
5. **Research Article - And a central repository of formal research reports relating to evidence-based policing.**

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Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from Wiltshire Police, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing to the:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Force Disclosure Unit within 20 working days of the Force's response to the original Fol request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing to include confirmation of the reasons for the review. The review will be conducted by another Decision Maker, who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Force Disclosure Unit will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within twenty working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The Independent Decision Maker will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, taking into account the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the Independent Decision Maker will reply to the complainant with the result of the review. If the complainant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
